What has
changed?



For the last 20 years, ACIDI/VOCA has led development projects in Honduras, equipping farming families with **climate-smart technology, training, and financing.**



In 2006, we began helping agricultural producers access loans, so they could invest in better fertilizers, seeds, and equipment to grow their businesses. From 2005 to 2010, we facilitated **\$12 million in loans** to **5,400 farmers**.

When the Honduran economy slowed due to COVID-19, we supported **tourism growth from 2020-2022 that exceeded pre-pandemic levels** compared to similar destinations in the region.

As emigration from Honduras surged in 2018, we helped create **48,000 new or improved jobs** for Honduran workers from 2018-2025. Our partners invested **\$8.00 for every \$1.00 we put in**. Over **90% of our project participants** expressed their desire to remain in the country.

In recent years, climate resilience has become a growing priority, especially in the Honduran Dry Corridor. Since 2023, we have provided **climate-smart technologies** to 4,000 producers and assisted **7,227** producers in **securing loans**.
